

Boys Shoe Options

Students are required to wear one of these exact styles and shoes must be black. No variations will be permitted.



Note:

- Girls must wear neutral-colored ankle socks or no-show socks.
- Boys must wear neutral-colored socks.
- Girls must wear shorts or ankle-length neutral-colored leggings under their skirts.
- Boys must wear a black or brown belt.
- <u>All 7th 12th grade students are required to have a logo on their polo</u> <u>shirts.</u>

Casual Days & Spirit Wear

- Clothing must follow regular uniform guidelines.
- Girls must wear a skirt or dress.
- The following clothing will not be permitted: torn or sloppy in appearance, tank tops, muscle shirts, bare midriffs, low necklines, tight or otherwise revealing.
- Negative, outlandish, disrespectful messages and pictures on clothing will not be permitted.
- The administration reserves the right to make judgments on what is acceptable. Definitions, clarifications, and diagrams will be made available upon request.

P.E. Uniform Details

- Students in 1st-12th grade must wear a loose-fitting MCA t-shirt (may be purchased through the school office or on the school website).
- Boys must wear modestly fitting sweatpants, athletic pants, or shorts that go to the bottom of the knee.
- Girls (1st -3rd grade) may wear loose-fitting black basketball shorts that come to the bottom of the knee.
- Girls (4th-12th grade) may only wear black culottes ordered from Modesty in Motion (refer to pictures at bottom right of this section).
 When ordering culottes, measurements must be below the knee. The price is set by the supplier.
- Athletic shoes are required to participate in P.E.





Where to Purchase

- Uniforms are primarily available through Tommy Hilfiger Global Schoolwear; however, high school girls skirts are available through Lands' End and grade school girls skirts are available through Walmart.
- On the Tommy Hilfiger website and the Lands' End website, you may search "Martinsburg Christian Academy" to find the approved dress code for your student's grade.
- Each picture in the uniform guide is a clickable link that directs you to that particular uniform garment.

Accessories, Events, & Exclusions

Accessories, Hair, etc.

- Girls' hair should be clean and worn in a manner out of the eyes.
- Boys' hair should be clean and off the ears, eyebrows, and collar.
- No unnatural hair colors will be permitted.
- Hair accessories must be conservative and must match the uniform.
- Tasteful makeup may be worn with discretion by the 7th-12th grade girls.
- Jewelry should be minimal so as not to distract.
- No more than two pairs of matching earrings may be worn (and must be worn in the ear lobes).
- No ankle bracelets may be worn.
- Boys may not wear necklaces, bracelets, or earrings.
- Secondary students must be clean shaven daily.

Events

- All students are required to wear the Official Uniform on chapel days.
- Secondary students will be required to wear black dress shoes with their official uniform for Fine Arts.
- Grade school students may be asked to wear a long sleeve white button down shirt with their khaki bottoms for special events. The shirt may be purchased from any company the parent chooses. Ties will be provided by the school.
- Girls may not wear slacks, shorts, capri pants, or tight-fitting clothing to any MCA event.

Exclusions

- Please avoid the following: overdone makeup or jewelry, torn or soiled clothes, visible undergarments, distracting accessories, and/or patterned leggings.
- Students may not wear any garments that are not included in the Uniform Guide or any garments that are purchased from other sources.

Miscellaneous

- The administration reserves the right, if deemed necessary, to adjust the Uniform or Dress Code Policy throughout the school year. In the event of updates, parents and students will be notified in writing.
- If desired, students may purchase only the Required Official Uniform; however, optional uniforms may be purchased as well.
- Uniforms must be clean and pressed daily.
- If uniforms show wear, they will need to be replaced within two weeks of notification.
- Students may only wear the sweaters included in the Uniform Policy. No other layering garments may be worn in the classroom.
- Optional uniform sweaters may be worn on days the Official Uniform is required.
- Only the top button of polos/shirts may be left unbuttoned.
- Clothing must be loose enough not to be form-fitting.
- Girls: All skirts and culottes must be loose-fitting and come to the bottom of the knee.
- Boys: All pants must be an appropriate length (inseam not extending shoe soles or above the ankle). Pants may not be rolled up.
- Shirts may not be form-fitting and must be tucked in properly at the waist.
- Demerits will be given for any uniform or dress code violation.
- Past uniforms that are not approved in the current uniform guide will not be permitted.
